Spring

Repair or replace **roof** if needed Check **exterior drainage** & gutters Clean **HVAC**. Professional inspection Clean up **yard**/ trim **trees Plant** new shrubs or flowers

Summer

Pest control -inside and outside Clean patio or deck Scrub or re-grout tiled surfaces Clean windows inside and outside Clean and de-clutter garage Shampoo carpets



Fall

Get **chimney** cleaned **Seal cracks** in paved areas Clean **HVAC**. Prepare for cooler weather Repair **window screens** Flush **water heater** & remove sediment Check your **thermostat Caulk** if needed

Winter

Seal around **doors** and **windows Deep clean** the inside of your house Sort through and **donate** unused items **Organize** closets and drawers **Fertilize lawn & plants** for winter **Winterize** your pool Reverse the direction of your **ceiling fans**

Monthly

- Change HVAC filters: Replacing your system's filter every month will help make it run efficiently.
- Clean & freshen your kitchen disposal: Nobody likes their kitchen to smell bad. Cleaning your disposal monthly with vinegar and baking soda will keep it fresh and unclogged.
- Inspect your fire extinguisher: What could be more important than having a handy, functioning fire extinguisher in case of a kitchen emergency?

4 Times Per Year

- Test your smoke & carbon monoxide detectors: These devices need new batteries periodically. Make a schedule to see if they are operating properly.
- Run water in unused plumbing: The P-shaped trap beneath sinks, tubs, and showers is meant to hold water. It keeps nasty gases from coming into your house through the sewer line.
- Add salt to your water softener: Water softeners save your other appliances from mineral build-up, help protect your skin and hair, and keep your dishes free of water spots. Maintaining the salt level keeps them working properly and saves you in other areas.
- Remove mineral deposits from shower heads and drains: Letting hard water build up can cause a multitude of household problems like clogged shower heads or broken pipes. It is a good idea to remove hard water before it damages the surface of the pipe or fixture.

2 Times Per Year

- Deep clean your house: Inspect and thoroughly clean every area of your home. It will keep things looking nice and save you money.
- Vaccuum refrigerator coils: These get particularly dusty. It causes your refrigerator to work harder, decreasing its life span. Your refrigerator costs you about 15% of your energy bill. Keeping it clean and working properly saves you money.
- Check plumbing for drips and running water: Dripping faucets or showers often go unnoticed until the problem is severe. Take a moment to watch and see if there are any leaks that might be costing you money.
