





Replace Your Porch Light

The one light you want to leave burning the entire time you're gone is the porch light. That means you need it not to burn out. Put a new bulb in before you leave to avoid this.

Put Inner Lights on a Timer

Other than your front porch, it looks odd to leave lights on all night long while you're away. In fact, this can be more of a giveaway to burglars that you aren't home, so don't do it. If you really want to leave lights on inside, put them on a timer to turn on and off at usual hours. Timers can be purchased for as little as \$30 at a local hardware store.





Don't Forget the Garage

If possible, remove garage door openers from any cars (even those in the garage) and relocate them to a safe place inside. If your car is broken into, don't make it worse by giving criminals access to your house. It's also recommended to lock the interior door from the garage into the house (just remember to bring the key with you).

Put Your Hide-a-Key Inside

There's no sense in leaving an extra key around while you're not there to use it, so don't.






Ask the Post Office to Hold Your Mail

Hide Valuable Items
